Throughout the session today we will provide time for individual reflection about evaluation in your own program. This tool will assist you in tracking your ideas as we move through the agenda.

### Activity 2: Evaluation Purposes, Goals, and Questions

#### Summary Table

Purpose	Types of Goals	Types of Questions	Sample Questions
<b>Developmental</b>	Developing a new model or approach	Questions about an issue or situation	What is the situation? How does this issue, practice, or initiative relate to larger systems? What needs to happen to address this issue?
<b>Formative</b>	Improving and refining an existing model	Questions about activities or practices	What are program strengths and weaknesses? What works, for whom, and under what conditions?
<b>Summative</b>	Demonstrating impact of a well-established model	Questions about outcomes or impact	Does the program work? Is this program a best practice that should be taken to scale?

1. Thinking about where your program is right now, what are your primary evaluation goals?
  
2. Are these goals developmental, formative, or summative?
  
3. What do you want to learn through evaluation? What questions do you have?

## Activity 4: Matching Data to Evaluation Goals and Questions

Think about what you heard about GEAR UP Wyoming. In your table group, decide which tools in the Data Collection Tool Table (found in your folder) you would use to answer the following evaluation question:

**What are students' and parents' perceptions of the helpfulness of GEAR UP Wyoming services?**

Note that GEAR UP Wyoming services include:

- College preparatory advising for students and parents (e.g., selecting college-bound courses in high school, completing the FAFSA, understanding grants and scholarships)
- ACT test preparation
- Academic tutoring
- College visits
- Family activities (e.g., service learning projects, family fun nights)

Use the chart paper and markers provided to document your table group's decisions. When you select a data collection tool, be sure to specify the most appropriate stakeholder group for that tool (e.g., a survey for students or a focus group for parents). Finally, provide a rationale for your choices.

**Activity 6: Making Evaluation Results Meaningful**

Review the four key stakeholders you identified on page two above.

Use the table below to record how evaluation findings could be helpful to each of these stakeholders. Also, brainstorm ways to share evaluation findings with these stakeholders.
