OVER THE COURSE OF TEN MONTHS, the District Leadership Institute (DLI) initiates and engages a learning community of senior-level leaders in a profound learning experience focused on creating, sustaining, and strengthening the college going culture in GEAR UP districts. The DLI examines the unique role of district leaders to leverage the impact that GEAR UP's federal resources provide in creating systemic change, with a resulting positive and sustainable impact on students' college and career readiness.

DLI combines three in-person trainings (five days total of professional learning), opportunities for cohort problem-solving discussions throughout the year, collaboration activities between GEAR UP program directors and district leaders along with the benefits of a tightly-knit professional learning community to create high-leverage professional learning that builds capacity for leading a coherent college readiness strategy in districts of all sizes.

PROGRAM FACULTY

Two highly experienced and veteran GEAR UP partners will lead DLI:

DR. ALAN INGRAM, is the former Deputy Commissioner for the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, and Superintendent of the Springfield Public School District, MA. Throughout his career in public education, he has served in a variety of roles focused on improving equity and access opportunities for all students. Dr. Ingram also led the GEAR UP partnership grant for the Oklahoma City School District serving a dual cohort of over 5,000 students and their parents, across a variety of sites, including high schools and alternative education programs, in partnership with seven higher education institutions, a career technology center, and community agencies.

DR. JOHN BARKER, is the Former Deputy Superintendent over the operational areas for the Shelby County Schools district in Memphis, TN. Prior to this role, Dr. Barker was

the Chief Accountability Officer for Chicago Public Schools, and served in various roles with Memphis City Schools. He also serves as a Senior Advisor at the National Council for Community and Education Partnerships (NCCEP). Dr. Barker co-leads the organization's efforts in leadership development programming including NCCEP's District Leadership Institute. He holds the Ph.D. in Education and Human Development from Vanderbilt University and is committed to sharing lessons learned from practice and supporting leaders in the complex task of decision making.

DLITUITION

The tuition for the program is \$5,000 per participant. Given the issues to be addressed in the Institute, districts are encouraged to bring leadership teams of up to a maximum of three representatives. While the makeup of districts may vary significantly by region, the program is intended for district "central" leadership, rather than school-based leaders.

Tuition fees do not include travel to the convenings, hotel accommodations, and other travel related cost. GEAR UP programs can leverage the five days of professional learning their senior leaders dedicate to the program as match.

Participants are expected to commit to attending each of the five sessions when applying and should reserve the in-person meeting dates listed on page 2. Class sizes are limited to facilitate group learning. Participants will be accepted to the program on a first-come, first-served basis. Please note that: (1) full payment must be processed prior to the first convening (July 16), (2) tuition is not refundable, (3) substitutions are allowed only in coordination with NCCEP before the first convening.
